

Catch Up Fund Review 2018/19

Allocation and Budget

Catch up funding is used in school to raise the achievement of year 7 students who achieved a scaled score of less than 100 by the end of Key Stage 2. This fund is used to bridge the progress gap during year 7.

Queensbridge School has identified the students in year 7 with the lowest Key Stage 2 scale scores. These students will be monitored during each assessment cycle and, where necessary, supported to make expected and better than expected progress in literacy and numeracy as identified in this statement.

Strategies and Interventions 2017-2018

Overview

Teacher assistant support for literacy and Numeracy

TAs deployed in subjects areas to specifically support literacy and numeracy to ensure progress.

Numeracy Breakfast

Short, 15 minute sessions, twice a week on a small group basis to promote engagement with Numeracy and develop mathematic ability. This will also promote punctuality to school.

Targeted Curriculum intervention (Numeracy)

Where possible, year 7 students identified as low ability will be placed in our numeracy intervention which will promote improved numeracy and confidence in numeracy.

Weekly Reading

Class reading books have been provided and where needed groups have been differentiated to support engagement with reading and an improved ability. These interventions will happen on a weekly basis for 30 minutes.

Catch Up program

This year, students identified as low ability and or below chronological reading age, will be supported through the Catch up Program. This is designed to improve literacy at the early stages of KS3.
