4	Excellent	<p>Consistently focused and engaged in all lessons. Always completes classwork and homework to a high standard. Works effectively as part of a group and independently. Provides an exemplary role model for learning.</p>
3	Good	<p>Usually focused and engaged in lessons. Reliably completes classwork and homework to expected standards. Able to work independently and as part of a group. Presents a positive role model for learning.</p>
2	Inconsistent	<p>Sometimes needs to be refocused during lessons. Unreliable in completion of classwork and homework to expected standards. Needs to be closely directed and does not participate well in group tasks. A lack of engagement can limit their own learning and that of others in the class. Doesn't always take an active part in lessons.</p>
1	Poor	<p>Frequently needs to be refocused during lessons. Classwork and homework is usually incomplete. Needs to be very closely directed and does not participate well in group tasks. Behaviour limits their own learning and that of others in the class.</p>
